As can be seen from the Accounts (Attachment A) the club started the financial year (31/8/17) with an opening balance of £8,998.59. Income over the year has amounted to £19,101.28 with Subscriptions slightly down on 2016/17 but clothing income significantly increased over the same period. However, the club has had to meet a number of obligations during the year which has resulted in an expenditure of £18,477.11. This has left a closing balance of £9,622.76, slightly up on last year.

Kit - Ken Sheldon

The aim during the year has been to build up a range of sizes in stocks of Key Items, exchanging some of the Club's bank balance into kit for immediate sale to meet members' demands. A large order is due to arrive by end Sep/early Oct, after which time we should be well set to meet (most) demand into next Summer. Key items are defined as those which will certainly sell eventually. All are in Men's fit in the White pattern, and they are:

- FRC Bib Shorts
- FRC Jersey Short Sleeve
- FRC Skin Suits Short Sleeve
- Tenax Bib Shorts
- Tenax Thermal Bib Tights
- Tenax Jersey Short Sleeve
- Tenax Jersey Long Sleeve

It is proposed to stay with the current list of Key items, not least because stock value will peak at £6.4k, representing a large proportion of the Club's reserves.

Further salient points - the Vero range has been superseded by Tenax. Other items are available (Black, Gold and various garments) at members' requests, provided at least 60% of any batch is against a firm order.

The Kit situation is I believe stable and healthy. A management system has been developed in which control is positive, and kit stocks are now part of the formal audit trail. Demand now is largely for wear and tear replacements and new members, and as such it is very manageable.

I am willing to retain responsibility for kit for another year. Given the financial implications, it seems obvious that the task must be performed by a Committee Member, and I am therefore willing to put myself forward for election.

I would however be very happy to pass on the kit task, and the Committee place, should someone else wish to take the place.

Proposals to be put to the membership at the AGM

To clarify when an Emergency Committee Meeting is appropriate and to ensure that it includes appropriate representation, the Committee recommends that section 3.5 be revised as follows:

3.5 Where an Officer of the Club cannot, in relation to a critical matter, decide alone and deems it too long to wait for the next General Committee Meeting, any three of the following Officers can act as an Emergency Committee: Captain; Chairman; President; General Secretary; Treasurer. The Emergency Committee may, as they deem appropriate, call any other Committee Member to participate in the Emergency Committee. A full report in writing will be circulated to the General Committee before the next General Committee Meeting.

Because of legislative changes surrounding personal data the Committee recommends the addition of the following clauses to Section 5, Membership.

- 5.8 The Club uses members' personal data to maintain a record of subscription payments, to provide information about the Club, to communicate regarding the administration of Club activities, and to contact member's designated emergency contact when necessary.
- 5.9 The Committee is the Controller of the Data and the Membership Secretary is the Data Processor.
- 5.10 Member's personal data are held in a database protected by appropriate measures and procedures from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure.
- 5.11 Members' data are not shared with any other organisation.
- 5.12 Members may request a copy of the personal data held on record by the Club and request its correction or deletion. Such requests must be made in writing to the Data Processor.
- 5.13 A member whose records have been deleted will receive no further communication from the Club.
- 5.14 The Club uses images of members participating in Club activities in its promotional activities. Members may decline such use by notifying the ride leader, event organizer, or photographer.

Section 7 of the Constitution is currently limited in scope to those events organised by the Rides Committee. The committee recommends that it be revised and extended to cover other activities and to clarify members' responsibilities, as follows:

7 (original) Club Rides

- 7.1 All the events organised by the Rides Committee shall be under the control of the Captain, or in the Captain's absence the Vice-Captain, or the Ride Leader.
- 7.2 Rides may be altered before or whilst ongoing at the discretion of the Captain or Ride Leader.
- 7.3 All Club members attending the events organised by the Rides Committee must behave in all ways as instructed by the Captain, Vice-Captain or Ride Leader, and when on the road must conform to the advice given in the Highway Code. On rides each rider must keep at least a foot behind the rider in front. Bicycles must be roadworthy and fitted with full mudguards when the climatic and road conditions dictate.
- 7.4 The pace of the Club Ride shall be the pace of the slowest rider present.
- 7.5 If, in the opinion of the Captain, Vice-Captain, or Ride Leader, a Club member misbehaves, the Captain or the Vice-Captain may report him to the General Secretary, who shall ask the Club member to attend the next Committee Meeting, at which the matter will be discussed.

7. (revised) Club Activities

- 7.1. All the events organised by the Rides Committee shall be under the control of the Captain, Vice-Captain, or Ride Leader. Other activities shall be under the control of the Organiser or Ride Leader.
- 7.2. Rides may be altered before or whilst ongoing at the discretion of the Captain or Ride Leader

- 7.3. Members participating in club activities assert that they are sufficiently fit and healthy. On rides each rider must keep at least a foot behind the rider in front. Their cycle must be in a roadworthy condition and fitted with full mudguards when the climatic and road conditions dictate.
- 7.4. Whilst participating in Club activities members must act responsibly and follow the Highway and Countryside Codes. Marshals, where present, are solely to indicate the direction. It is the member's responsibility to ensure that any manoeuvre is carried out safely.
- 7.5. Gloucester City Cycling Club, its officials, and its members cannot be held responsible for any personal injury, accident, loss, damage or public liability during events organized on behalf of the Club.
- 7.6. Club activities are covered by the Club's Liability Insurance. Members are advised to obtain their own insurance.
