General Secretary

The year has been particularly hectic because of membership churn, helping to set up a new web site and revamped Facebook page, support for Jubilee 125 events and requests from BBC Radio Gloucester to comment on cycling issues. In addition, and not related to the task of General Secretary, I took over the Club Clothing task. We have ordered and distributed to members the thick end of £10,000 of kit during the year, a time-consuming task; the easiest part has been the excellent support in every way from the staff at Yellow, our sponsors.

Membership seems to have stabilised at around 230, with about 30 leaving each Winter and 30 joining each Spring/Summer. A major task involves gathering in subscriptions and chasing up the relatively small number of late payers. For the Gen Sec and the Treasurer this has always been a major task over the period from October to February, which would be much easier if all members were to either set up a Standing Order or respond at the first time of asking by paying, preferably online. Cheques are next best because they have your names on them, and finally cash to the Treasurer who is the only person who can give you a receipt. So this is the first call – the Treasurer is in the room and he has his receipt book with him!

It has become evident that Membership Management is a large enough task in its own right to be split away from that of the Gen Sec. Further, Club membership does not necessarily include the BC membership management. Indeed, the job of BC representative is more likely to be appropriate for an active racer and such a person is unlikely to have the time needed to also act as Membership Secretary.

The core element of the Gen Sec's job is communication. This will always include the vital task of raising Agendas and producing Minutes of monthly Committee and General Meetings. There is little if any call now for letters but the General Secretary also operates the gcccsec@gmail.com account, acts as an Administrator on the Facebook Page and updates the Web Calendar as required. More generally, the task includes making sure that any matters that arise are passed to the appropriate Committee Member for action. This last aspect will become less onerous on future in that Membership queries will be directed to the new Membership Secretary and general enquiries will be dealt with by the Captain.

I said last year that this would be my last. My last action as General Secretary will be to produce the Minutes of this meeting, unless of course my successor wishes otherwise. I will remain available to provide a handover and support for as long as required.

Vice-Captain The 1250 "long" rides have been a well received addition to the calendar.

Steve Taylor/Summer Road Races The cat 3/4 road race (summer road race), was well attended (all 60 places
taken) and a great success, although a disappointing turnout from GCCC riders. The Steve Taylor Road Race (cat
