TREASURERS REPORT FOR 1985

Mr President, Ladies & gentlemen.

Once again I am able to report that the clubs finances are in a healthy position.

The Balance Sheet shows that the number of subscriptions paid has increased by only one on the previous year this, however is misleading as several members have claimed Honorary Membership during the year the number of junior members has increased from three to eight.

The clubroom after a poor start has turned in a small surplus. This is the first full year when the rent has £4.00 per evening for the full year. The total attendance dropped from last years record of 708 to 687. For the first half of the year the average was 16.6 against the previous years 18.5 while the second half of the year averaged 11 against 10 for the previous year.

It would help considerably if someone would be prepared to run the counter for at least the winter months. In the past the proceeds from the counter have produced an average of £25 to the clubs funds. This year during the three months it was run only £9. was made.

I am sure you will all agree that the club has promoted more events this year than ever. With 3 open time trials and 5 Road Races a great deal of organisation has been required. Financially the 8 events produced a surplus of £15.15.

With a charge of nearly £113 for engraving trophies and medals I do not think the club can be accused of overcharging on entry fees.

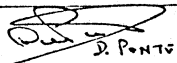

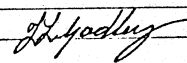
