TREASURERS REPORT 1990.

Mr President Ladies & Gentlemen,

As we enter the clubs centenary year I am pleased to be able to report another successful year and that the clubs finances are in a healthy position.

The balance sheet shows that the number of subscriptions received has this year increased by 16 the largest increase for some years. Senior membership increased by 13 and Family by 5 Junior membership reduced by 2.

Most of the events promoted by the club produced a small surplus to help to pay the engraving bill which this year increased by over £100 on the previous year.

One account which is giving some concern is the Club Room. Attendances have this year dropped from last years record of 1008 to 865 a reduction of 143 and as a result the surplus has dropped to £26.

The club has managed to raise a considerable sum - almost £600 towards expenses which will be incurred during our Centennial Year.

As to the other figures I leave you to read the balance sheet for the year.

Before I go into any detail of what has been happening during the year on club runs, I would just like to thank Ann the Vice Captain who has made my job easier this year by being very enthusiastic and full of ideas. I would also like to thank Toby for producing the new runs list.

Since January the average attendance on club runs has been 20 members at coffee. The club runs have now reverted to having more all-day runs, which includes more picnics and such frivolities as Cider and wine tasting. A regular hard core of riders now attend each week which makes a change from just the Captain turning up. As you know this includes a few regular women - I am an avid supporter of women joining the club: so is Ann, as it can sometimes be a bit 'isolated' for her if only men turn up.

Since January we have reinstated the Club Runs Book. Anyone wishing to read it may do so. As from April 13th Ann has done a small weekly write-up for the 'Citizen' - these cuttings are kept in the afore mentioned Runs Book.

The Rhayader weekend has now been extended to start on a Friday evening so the touring section can have 2 nights at a B & B: this proved very popular this year and will be repeated next year. Also the club entered the Hell of The North Cotswolds for the first and won the Schneider Cup for the best team entry — the cup is circulating among all those who took part; our entry was organized by Ann.

During the summer evenings small groups of mountainbikers went for evening excursions; this still continues on some Saturday afternoons.

The Night ride has been successfully reinstated this year, which was also organized by Ann. A cider weekend was also initiated this summer and will now be an annual event. I hope these unusual events will be well supported. I would just also like to say that the new runs lists are more varied with a good selection of members leading the rides. This reflects a healthy touring section, and good fun is had by all members.

A new trophy has been made and donated to the club by Bruce Webber. This is to be awarded to the club member with the most punctures on club runs during the club year
