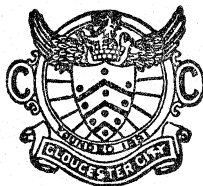

TREASURERS REPORT FOR 1990/91

Mr President Ladies and Gentlemen,

It gives me pleasure to be able to present to you the balance sheet for the the clubs Centenary Year 1991.

The balance sheet shows that for the fifth year running the number of subscriptions received has increased. Senior subscriptions have increased by five and Family by one while the Junior has decreased by four. Most of our Junior members now seems to be covered by Family membership. The total membership of the club is now 143.

The major fund raising event of the year must be the 100 Mile Sponsored Ride which raised a total of £1093. Half of this sum went to the Centenary Fund and half was donated to the Prestbury Cancer Committee. I am sure you will wish to give a vote of thanks to all those who rode in this event.

All of the events promoted this year have produced a small surplus to help pay for the trophy engraving bill which increased by over £100 on the previous year. Unfortunately the proposed Gloucester Centenary Road Race had to be cancelled.

The Club Room account has been able to produce a small surplus once again but with an increase in hire charges it will be necessary to increase charges this coming year. The total number of attendances was 845 - 20 down on last year with an average number per evening of 18.4.

You will all have noticed the proposition on your agenda to increase subscriptions for the forthcoming year. It is now five years since the last increase, during this time the number of members has almost doubled and this has enabled the increased costs to be covered. The main problem is that most of the cost of promoting events are incurred at the start of the year and monies do not come in until the event takes place. Even the Annual Dinner requires a deposit of £100.

During the last few years very little money has been spent on equipment. Some of the road race flags and signs etc. are now very shabby and will need to be replaced very soon. An increased income will enable us to do this.

As to other figures I leave you to read the balance sheet for yourselves.

In conclusion I would like to thank all the officials that have promoted events this year. Most of you have managed to get your sums right first time and been able to help club funds. This makes my job much easier.
