The points awarded for organising events was also increased this year from 20 points to 25 points. & The B.C.T.C event was taken of the social competion as a sconng event, as this event has a seperate trophy awarded to the winner. During the dark winter months of last year we had a varied and interesting dray of slide shows, which I am sure every body enjoyed. So I would like to thank every body & who organised events and entertained us, including RILL with his training exercises.

CAPTAIN'S AND VICE-CAPTAINS REPORT.

The touring section has had another successful year due to great efforts by me and the Vice-captain Ann. Even throughout the winter months there is a good group of people out each Sunday on Club Runs, with most age groups catered for.

The tendancy now is towards all-day rides, with lunch stops being nearer Gloucester in the winter, and further away in the summer. Occasionally we have afternoon tea stops such as in Tewkesbury or Ross-on-Wye.

Aswell as commercial coffee stops we also stop at the houses of various club members or their friends; eg. Bill and Vera Henry, Bill and Brenda Gregory, Eric and Anthea Moody, Paul and Jane Green and Frances at Silver Street. For the annual Holly Run we stop at John Carroll's house. These destinations make a nice change and retain links with some of those people who otherwise don't get out much nowadays.

In March there was a very good long weekend based in Brecon. 12 people took part in that with some vivid memories of gale-force winds, hills and rough stuff over the Brecon Beacons, followed by a fantastic dinner. In April the club entered 21 people for The Hell of The North Cotswolds; the 100 kilometer ride is based in the Cotswolds above Winchcombe. Mountain bikes aren't a requirement, although 90% of entrants use them.

This year both Night Rides fell within the months covered by the club calendar. Last September was the epic three Castles Ride when we slept in Grosmont Castle. We took our stoves, food and various things to sleep in -ranging from a sleeping bag and survival bags to a cape. It was decided that the best and warmest item was a sleeping bag. Consequently this June when we went through Stratford-on-Avon we all took sleeping bags aswell as stoves.

Also we have had 2 Interclub Runs to meet the Speedwell B.C. One to The Farmers Arms, Guiting Power, and one to the Green Dragon at Bishops Frome. Next Sunday we are scheduled to meet them at The Brewers Arms, West Malvern. It is always good to retain links with other clubs: their club dinner is in Bourton-on-the-Water on Sunday 1st November - if anyone is interested.

Each month we hold our AA-ride, which sometimes attracts new people. If it doesn't then we use a 'plan' B - with a slightly longer route to coffee. It depends on who is there, as Rule number 22 says 'The pace of the club run shall be the pace of the slowest rider present'. As shown on the new runs list there is now a 'Sports Ride' for those people who want to go faster and cover more miles before coffee. Aryone wanting a faster ride can go on that or the training ride. The Club Run is essentially a touring ride and this must not be forgotten: Saddle bags are the order of the day!

The winners of the Dancey Trophy are once again Mike Davis and Ann Wooldridge with 97 points. Toby Wooldridge is the runner up with 91 points. The Jim Burnett Trophy for the best junior attendance on club runs goes to Anthony Shearet with 22 points. Bruces Bonus has been awarded to Toby Wooldridge with 3 punctures. We would like to remind all members to ride carefully at all times. It is unwise to ride quickly in large groups along country roads—times. Evening Club Runs are held throughout the summer: the best attendances in these are noted down and count towards the social competition. Tights are essential if you wish to stop at a pub, and it would be nice if a few more people turned up at the club house for the start of the ride instead of riding to the destination on their own. People do give up their time to take sure someone is there to lead the ride, whatever the weather.

On New Years Eve we held our annual Midnight Ride, this time to Nut Fill. To as you can see, there has been a lot of different types of rides, involving various amounts of arranging. From ensuring that each Club Run has a coffee stop arranged, to the Bed and Breakfast accommodation necessary for a weekend away. I would also like to thank Toby for doing the layout and printing of the Runs lists every few months; this takes a lot of his time.... thank you Toby. Usually things run smoothly which all point to a well-lun section of the club. Let's keep it that way.

TREASURERS REPORT FOR 1992.

Mr President Ladies and Gentlemen,

After the previous year when the clubs finances reached a very low point I am pleased to be able to report that this year we have made a very good recovery.

The number of subscriptions paid has decreased by 5 on the previous year to 82, but with the increases made at the last AGM. an additional £139.00. has been found. The overall membership of the club at 30th. August 1992 was 139 a decrease of 3, however 24 members have not renewed their membership for 1992 and will now be deleted. The previous years figure was 19.

I feel that mention must be made and our thanks given to all the members who have made donations to the club which have amounted to £147.00. This is more than double last years figure.

You will be pleased to know that with the exception of the T.G.Hall 25 of 2nd. May, which was cancelled due to road-works, each open and club event produced a surplus, making an overall profit of £280.00. If this amount is taken from the total cost of trophy engraving, medal etc. a surplus of approximately £10.00 is made. This is the first time for at least 10 years that club funds have not had to find at least £100.00 each year towards these costs.

The Clubroom has again shown a drop in the number of attendances from 845 to 708 to give an average attendance of 17 for the year as against 18 for 1991. With the policy of closing the Clubroom for one evening each month a surplus of £133.50 was made.

Other income has come from the club draw£250.00, sale of the remaining Centenary Glasses£160.40 and contributions towards medals £53.00.

While most items of expenditure increased during the year the amount was not as much as anticipated. This is with the exception of the trophy insurance. The premium for this insurance doubled from £50.00 to £100.00. This is now the minimum for this type of insurance. However the amount of cover has also increased. For this year the valuation of the trophies, with the exception of the T.G.Hall Trophy was doubled. All the trophies must be revalued this year.

On the down side it was with regret that the Annual Dinner had to be cancelled, as a result a total of £130.00 has been lost over two years. Another cancelled event was the Club Disco which showed a loss of £25.00.

With the improvement in the clubs finances we have this year been able to make several purchases to replace worn out equipment. I know the committee are hoping to continue this process next year, some of the road race gear is in a very poor state.

In conclusion I am sure you would wish to thank all the various event organisers and officials who by a lot of hard work have helped to restore the clubs financial position. Given your support I am sure 1993 can be just as successful.
