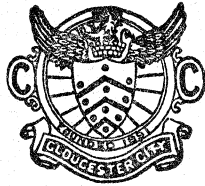

## TREASURERS REPORT FOR 1993.

Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Another club year has ended and it gives me pleasure to report that it has been a successful one as far as the clubs' finances are concerned.

At first glance one could be forgiven for thinking that it had not been so with a decrease of over £600 in the club's cash balance. However at the start of the year £250 was being held for the National Junior 25 TT which we promoted in 1992 and £250 from the club draw was earmarked for the purchase of Racing Equipment.

The actual amount spent on equipment was over £422. Some people have been very puzzled at the sight of bright florescent jackets standing on roundabouts waving coloured flags.

Membership is now at its highest for at least 25 years. With a steady growth over the last ten years the total membership now stands at 133 the number having more than doubled since 1984. A total of 19 new members were welcomed to the club during the year. Senior membership has dropped by 8 while Family has increased by 20. Some of this increase is due to members changing to family subscription to obtain the third party insurance cover for all members of their family. The number of names removed for non-renewal in 1992 was 24 while this year the number will be 16 the lowest for several years. The actual number of subscription paid has increased by two and I still managed to take an extra 50p from 16 members who forgot to pay their subs before the end of February.

The Annual Dinner & Dance, moved to November with a new venue, was an instant success and also produced a small surplus. The 1993 Dinner will again be in November at the same place so make sure you attend and help to continue this success.

The insurance of the club trophies caused some concern when the renewal premium was increased to £500.00, efforts to obtain further quotations showed no improvement on this figure and some companies declined to even make a quote. At one time it was thought that the insurance would have to lapse. Fortunately the CTC offered the same facility for £77.00. At the request of the insurers the trophies have now been re-valued. Last year the insurers doubled their value which rose to £10,113.00. The revised valuation reduced the value to £6975.00 and the total assets of the club reflect this figure.

The Clothing Committee have been very busy this year and have actually purchased, including the value of resale's, over £1600 worth of clothing. The £50.50 you see on the payments side of the balance sheet is for clothing ordered and not received or paid for at the end of the year.

Both the Club Racing and Clubroom accounts have held there own, but I will leave the respective secretaries to make there own reports.

As most of you will know the BCF has set up a Development Officer for this area. We are fortunate that the officer is one of our own members. During 1994 he will be assisting clubs to further promote cycling and we must not miss this opportunity to continue the growth of the club.

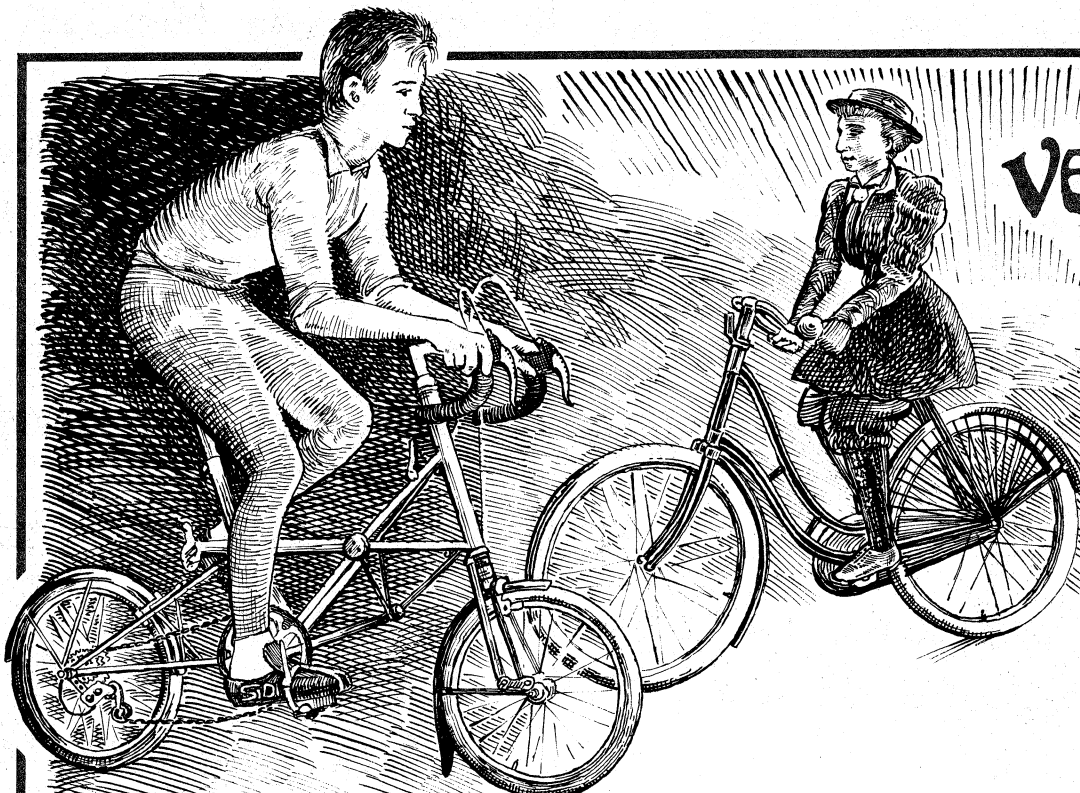

## CAPTAIN'S AND VICE-CAPTAIN'S REPORT.

The Club has once again had a good year of well supported activities. Last year Graham Cole decided to instigate a Sunday "Sports" Ride to cater for those members who wanted a fast morning ride. This has worked well I think - the 2 groups usually meet up at Elevesnes and if anyone on the "Sports" Ride wishes to stay out for lunch as quite often happens, they can do so. The Touring Section is very strong and caters for a wide range of people. From youngsters - we have had 9 out over the year, 2 being young ladies - 3 of whom have joined the club, and one who is about to join now. There is a constant group of Vets. who are out regularly, and a large number of members in their 20's & 30's. On one club run there were 6 ladies present.

We continue with our monthly AA-rides, designed to introduce people to club riding: the destinations for these rides are Nailsworth, Tewkesbury, Staunton, Upton-on-Severn and Cheltenham. They must be flat and relatively easy: if no-one now is out then they are adapted accordingly. A lot of members

In July 11 members took part in a sponsored ride in the Forest of Dean and the annual trip to the Black Mountains attracted 15 people - 2 being on an ATB tandem. In April the club entered 30 people in "The Hell of The North Cotswolds" and at the end of May 7 members went camping and touring from Nangynog in Wales.

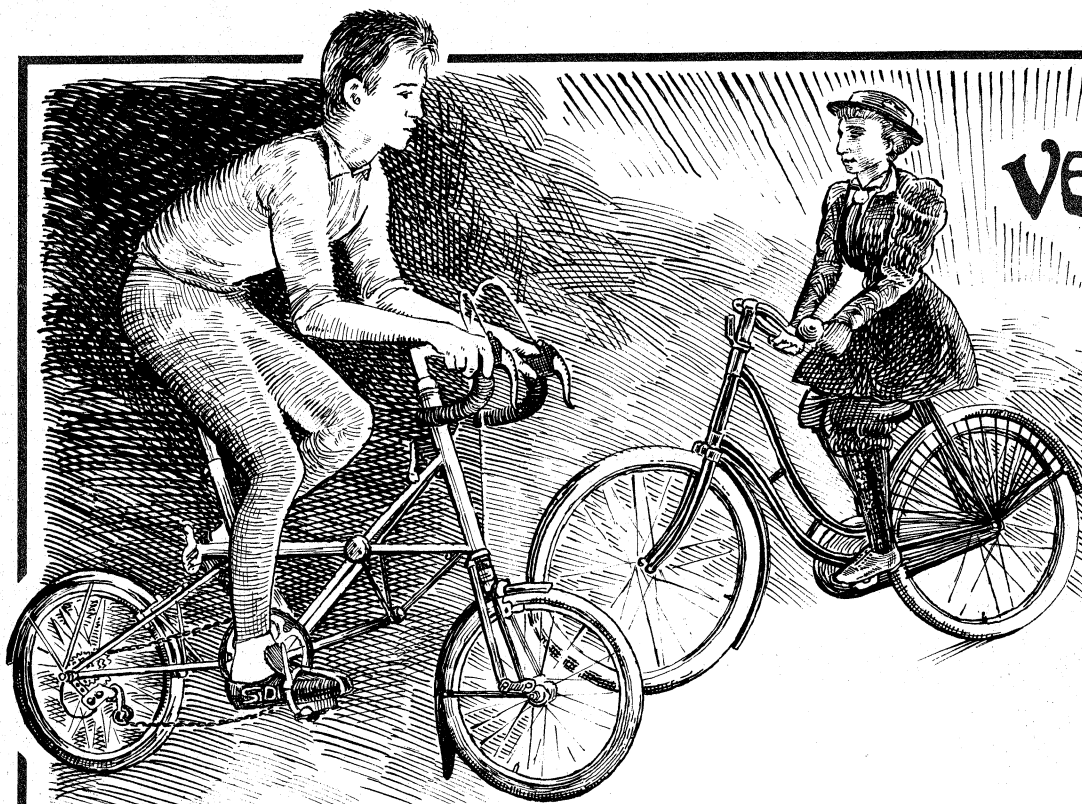

In December the club attends the CTC Cyclists Carol service and tea party, & there is something on offer every week of the year. I would like to thank all those who take the trouble to lead Club Runs and summer evening rides, and to Toby for producing and printing the Runs lists.

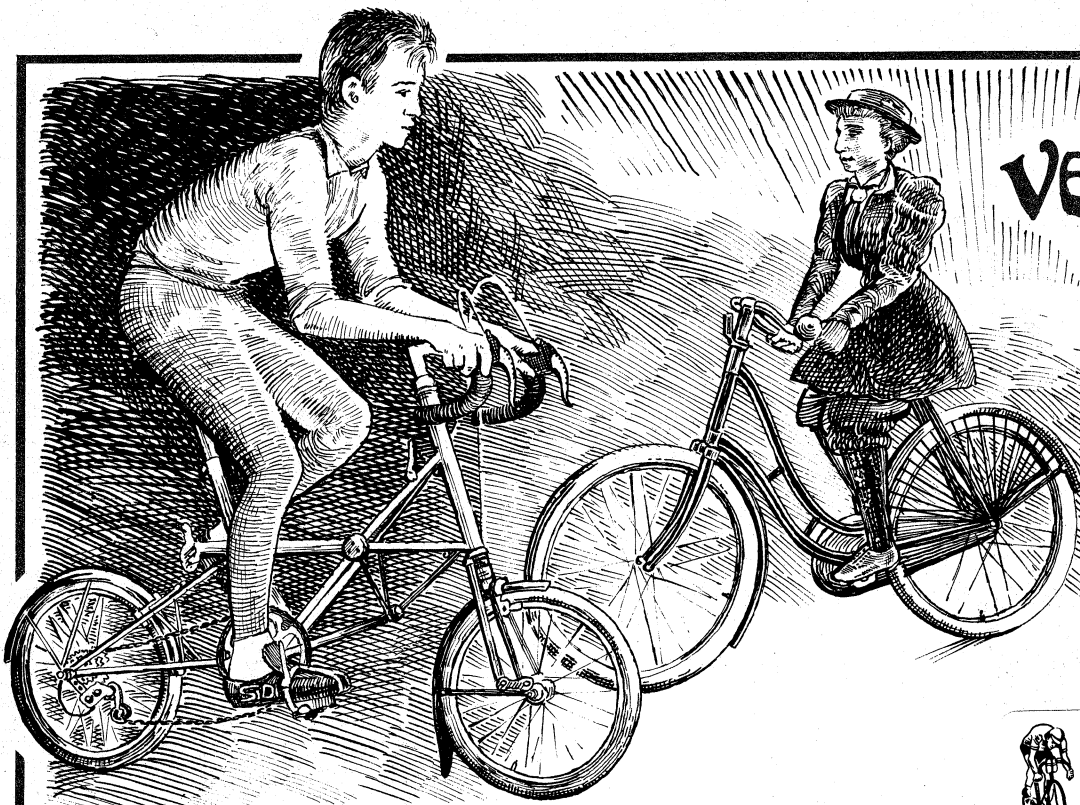

## The Gobb Shield.

A total of 8 events were held during the 1992-93 season.

The first, in November of last year was the Map Reading Competition. This was followed by the Trivia Quiz in December and the General Quiz in January. February saw a further development of the Photographic Competition, with the Cycling Quiz being held in March. This completed the events held during the darker months at the clubroom.

The longer summer evenings saw the competition move to the great outdoors, with the Speedjudging in June and Freewheeling in August. The eighth and final event was for Public House Attendance on Tuesday Evening Runs between April and August. With a total of eleven venues counting to the event, this was one of the most popular legs of the competition. Overall a total of 34 club members took part, compared to 32 for last year and 25 the year before.
