TREASURERS REPORT FOR 1994

Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Another club year has ended and it gives me pleasure to report that with continued growth in membership and in the clubs activities it has been a successful one as far as the clubs finances are concerned.

At first glance it looks as though we have made a profit of just over £900. on the years activities. However closer inspection of the balance sheet shows that we are holding £610 in the Sponsorship Account and over £142 in Clothing Account Deposits which leaves a balance of £148. An unexpected income was the £156. proceeds from the Glos Spring Centre street collection without which we would have made a small loss on the year.

The overall membership of the club is now 147 a rise of 14 on 1993. This is the highest for over 26 years and more than double that of ten years ago. The main growth has been in the Family Membership which stands at 59 and is now the largest group within the club. A total of 18 new members were welcomed during the year and four Day Subscriptions were taken out, one of which was converted to full membership. The number of names removed for Non-Renewal in 1993 was 16 which has dropped to 14 this year and I was only able to take an extra 50p from 13 members who forgot to pay their subs before the end of February. You will I am sure noted the resolution from the committee concerning renewal of membership for next year.

The Annual Dinner and Dance held in November, at the same venue as the previous year, once again produced a small surplus although the attendance was down by five on the previous year. The 1994 Dinner will be at the same venue and at the same price as last year, so make sure you attend and help to continue this success.

The club only made one major purchase this year, a second hand photo copier. This has enabled us to continue to produce the News Letter at a reasonable price. This should continue through the next year after which unless we can find a supply of master screens other methods of production will be required. If anybody thinks they can help to obtain any screens please see me for type and pattern number.

You may have noticed that the cost of the News Letter has risen from £49.50 in 1993 to £87.15. I have this year included the cost of postage involved for distribution as I feel this gives a truer picture of the costs involved. There has of course been a corresponding reduction on the Postage Account.

Both the Club Racing and Clubroom accounts have held their own, but I will leave the respective Secretaries to make their own reports.

I leave you to read the rest of the Balance Sheet detail and invite any questions or comments.

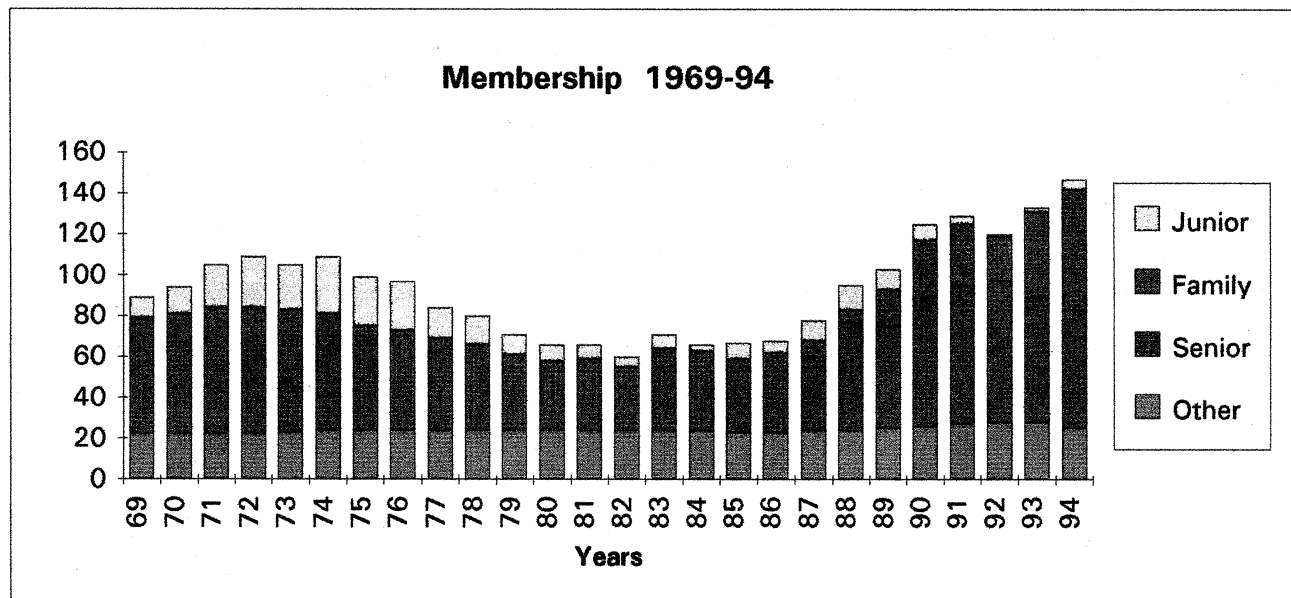

Over the past year the club-run section has thrived on a full program of events. There are many enthusiastic club members willing to lead rides, and this provides ~~more~~ variety in our routes to elevenses. This year we have found a couple of good new coffee shops - one being The Victoria Hotel, Newnham & the other The Burleigh Court Hotel near Brimscombe. The vice-captain Paul Barnard is to be thanked for these. The club regularly arranges ~~off~~ elevenses with the following club members whom I would like to thank for their hospitality: Bill & Vera Henry, Bill & Brenda Gregory, Eric & Anthea Moody, Paul & Jane Green, Pat Appleton and John Carroll.

This year the club has gained several youngsters. It is important to encourage them onto the club run first of all to build up basic miles and cycling skills. Advice is also given on what to carry with you & why. Then later on, if wished, they can start attending the Training Rides. Not everyone is interested in racing - a lot of people cycle for the social side of things. A good balance must be maintained, as I think it is at present.

There have been several C-category rides and weekends away. Starting in March with the well-attended housing weekend to Knighon, 10 members stayed at The Fleece House for 2 nights, and despite atrocious weather managed a good hilly route to the source of the Mule, eventually finding a good hostelry for lunch: This was a weekend to remember.

On April 10th the club entered 31 people in The Hell of The North Cotswolds and won the Schneider Cup for a 2nd time - we originally won it in 1990.

At the end of May 4 members had a second weekend away, this time near Church Stoke. The aim was to conquer The long Flynd, which of course they did.

On 31st July Toby Worthington led the annual Black Mountains Ride. As happened 2 years ago it began to pour with rain after Hay-on-Wye & so we climbed the Gospel Pass again. About mid-afternoon, just before Cross Ash, the sun

appeared and so a pleasant ride back to Poolmill for a cream tea followed. We were lucky with the weather for the Night Ride - the leader again being Toby Woodridge. The destination was Clevedon which was reached in the early hours of Sunday 13th August. 2 hours sleep on the beach ensued, then tea was brewed before setting off again for breakfast & a route through Chapstow and the Forest for lunch: 122 miles were covered.

In contrast to this we have our monthly AA-rides which are flat & easy paced, suitable for beginners. This summer the club has been host to the ASPTT Netz cycling club: In 1991 links were 1st established when a group of us stayed in Netz - it is good to keep up such links; ~~and~~ Back in Gloucester relationships with the Everham Wheelers, Speedwell B.C. & Cheltenham & County C.C. continue to flourish. It is good to exchange views & news & make new contacts.

The evening rides have gone well this year, finishing up with a large gathering at The House In The Tree, at Stawerton. The Jarvis family is to be thanked for their BBQ after the Speed Judging at Bulley Lane, as is Mike Davis for his BBQ after the Three Gires Ride. Mike Thomas held an excellent wine-tasting session at lunch time on Sept. 11th which he would like to become an annual event.

Back in July the Vice-Captain Paul Barnard organized a public Turbo Training session in Eastgate Street to raise funds for the club and for the local Spring Centre. There was an impressive display put on by club members as they pedalled away the mileage from Hand's End to John-o-Groats. It was a brilliant hot day, but members kept going all day - it wasn't as embarrassing to take part as it might have appeared, and hopefully we can do the same again next summer.

As you can see from the above report the year has been full of things to do. I have supplied the Citizen with

Regular club-run reports, and a few stunning photos of tourists have also appeared. It is important to keep the club mentioned in the local paper, whether racing or housing.

On a personal note I would like to thank the committee for helping me with expenses to attend a ladies Training weekend back in November. I feel I benefitted from it, and would just like to say "Thank You" for your support.

A Full winter social calendar helps to bring the club together & look forward to the next season. All ideas are gratefully received.

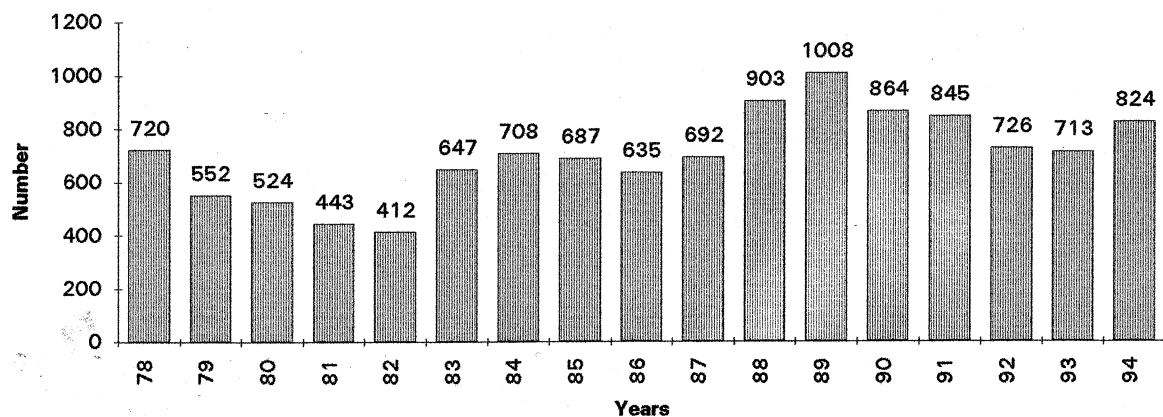
