COACH'S REPORT 1995

The 1995 season could arguably go down as the most successful in the club's history.

We had more wins during the 1990 season, but then most of the successes were due to riders of known ability who we had imported to make up a successful racing team. This year the successes have come from home grown talent who have reached a high level through application over many seasons. Perhaps the best indication of a club that must be doing something right.

As the club coach I am not going to take the credit for these results as in my view it is the open forum on training and racing that exists between all members of the club that has finally spread so much knowledge and information to each member. No longer do people flounder about not knowing what has to be done to reach the higher levels. There is a realism among the club's racing members that did not exist even a few years ago. Riders now realise that they must get stuck in to plenty of training and that there are no easy options or short cuts to success.

I would like to say to all members present to continue this open dialogue and not to keep your ideas and knowledge to yourselves. The more we all talk about training methods and racing tactics the more we all learn. Please don't let us ever go back to the days when people kept their training methods a secret.

I am a little reluctant to list our successes because I know that I will miss someone out who deserves mention, but here goes:

Pride of place must go to John Barnes who finally took the Division Road Race title and who although he has not raced so much this year has had his best ever "results per race" average. To this we have to add Gary Hobbs, Ian Humble and Rob Buckland who have all joined him as First Category riders. To see four Gloucester City riders on the start sheet of the Tour of the Cotswolds was something I would have thought beyond our reach. We have also seen Chris Alderwick, Simon Offord, Richard Clements and Andy Jarvis move to Second Category and a number of others highly competitive in Third Cat races. Next season should see these moving up.

In time trials we have had our share of good results with Alister Scott and Richard Clements gaining regular wins. Perhaps it is here that we have allowed lack of organisation to limit our success, for we have so often lacked a third counter to sew up the team wins when capable members have been riding elsewhere. I think though that it is Ann Wooldridge who has really taken the time trial honours this year. The metamorphosis from tourist fast woman racer has been gradual and a credit to the principle of sticking at your training through thick and thin. Her 14th in the Women's National 10 and her superb ride in the Three Cities were real highlights of the season.

There are others worthy of a mention: Andy Jarvis with his 22 mph plus BBAR average; Darren Jewell with his gutsy ride in the National Junior Road Race Championship; John Murphy's Three Cities ride, Nick Swan and James Martin's excellent performances in Juvenile events; Eddy Baud's Triathlon rides and this is where I run into trouble because there are numerous other performances worthy of mention which I haven't got the time or space to list. My apologies to them all now.

Also let us not forget the club riders who race at club level without ever gaining any great accolades. They are the backbone of the club and they all help to provide the great sociable atmosphere that is such a feature of the City club. This should never be underestimated for it is this atmosphere which keeps the racing members hanging in there when everything seems to be going wrong. Without this many of the people mentioned above would have packed it all in long before they ever discovered their true potential.

Finally a word of thanks to those who have taken an interest in coaching others. Gerard McGarr, Andy Jackson, John Barnes, Neil Armitage. The more we can get helping out the better attention we can give everybody.

Clubroom Captain 1994-95 Report of Year

Firstly I must apologise for my absence but by the time the Annual General Meeting takes place I will be back in Coventry, toiling away in the library for twelve hours a day no doubt - nobody realises how hard a students life is!

Before my report of the year begins I would like to say a BIG THANK YOU to everyone in the club for making the year I spent back in the area such an enjoyable one; a nicer, more friendly and more active club you would struggle to find.

John Godley has provided me with the facts and figures for the past twelve months, and these are as follows:

The attendance for the whole year was 900, the highest since 1989, with an average attendance per evening of 20 being the highest that we have ever had. As usual the winter months were the time when we had largest numbers with attendance dropping off during the summer. The total income from the clubroom was £817.07, with rent and expenses coming to £621.31 (we spent more this year on special evenings than in 1994) giving a balance of £195.95

My report of the year would not be complete without mentioning the individuals who have ensured that the job was challenging, fulfilling and enjoyable. The club President who without fail every Tuesday asked how much it was and then proceeded to tell me that he was sure that I'd got it wrong and complain that it was too much. Finally we come to McGarr who never paid up without a fight, either a) telling me he'd come after such and such a time and was therefore too late to pay, b) telling me that he was a member of the Longlevens Community Centre so didn't have to pay, or c) simply telling me that he wasn't paying.

To everyone who I extorted money out of over the year - **it was a pleasure.**
