Treasurers Report for 1996

Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Another club year has now finished and it is time to look back and judge if it has been a successful one or not. Taking everything into consideration I think we can be reasonably satisfied.

As regards to the clubs cash balance we are down £571.00 on the year, but it must be said that the committee has made one or two exceptional payments during the year. As most of you will know the old photo-printer gave up at the end of last year. We were lucky to be offered a used machine for £300.00 and have been able to continue with the Newsletter as well as printing the Runs List and various race start and finish sheets. We have also spent £163.00 on Racing Equipment including a Gas Burner for use at various races to provide cups of tea etc. The renovation of the TG Hall Trophy cost over £100. 00 and should, with it's new base be able to take another 20 years or so of engraving and the printing of the new Club Handbook cost us a further £125.00. The Clothing Account has now returned the £500.00 that was spent in advance in 1995. As requested at last years AGM I have shown the value clothing being held at the end of the year in the notes.

Although the membership is up the income from most events has dropped . For example Club Racing Fees are down from £230.00 to £154.00, The Clubroom is down from £195.00 to £78.00.

The Annual Diner and Dance again produced a small surplus, this appears as £98.31 on the balance sheet, however a £50.00 deposit was paid in 1995.

The membership of the club has continued to grow and now stands at 171 an increase of six on the previous year. This must be an all time high and is made up as follows:- Life/Vic Presidents/Honorary members 29, Senior members 67, Family Members 72. Junior members 3. Once again the number of Family members exceeds the Senior membership and for those of you who are statistically minded each Family membership is worth now worth exactly three members.

Twenty names were deleted in April due to non-renewal. This is the same number as in 1995.

One issue which must give some concern is the rising cost of posting the Newsletters and Runs Lists. While we are able to keep the production. at a very reasonable cost - approximately £16.00 per issue It now costs us 32p, for each one posted. With an average of 80 being posted each issue this adds up to £25.60 and is considerably more than the cost of producing them. To try and improve the situation the date when they will be available will be shown in the Runs List and members could help if they will come along to the clubroom and collect it.

The next issue will be available on Tuesday 14th January 1997 - the same evening as Club/BCF/RTTC Enrolment.

I leave you to read the rest of the Balance Sheet detail and invite any questions or comments.

General Secretaries Report

As befits a club of this stature, the City have had a busy ^{from} year ~~on~~ both an Organisational and Achievement point of view.

5 Open events have been organised by the Club, from the early season Steve Taylor RR to the late season October 25 T.T. Entrances have been variable, from a Full Field for the S.T., to 17 for the CCRH. This is a common pattern across all areas of the sport.

The club runs have been varied and well attended, with categories suitable for all cyclists. The early year rides split into 3, with a new Training category setting off at the early time of 8.30 am. This catered specifically for the racing Fraternity, with a high pace and no rest being the order of the day.

We continue to build our links with the Metz cycle clubs, and a trip to Gloucester's Twin Town was organised by Alastair Goldie in June. Although the distances were long, the tour was enjoyed by all 7 members.

The number of ladies participating on rides has been higher than for many years, although the club is still weak in this area.

Another area of concern is the lack of juniors in the ranks, again a common feature of cycling clubs around the country. To counteract this, a number of new members over the past year fall into the 20's age bracket. This leads me to think that the shortage of juniors is not as fatal as some pundits might think. ~~Quite a number of triathletes have joined our ranks,~~
~~staying~~ On the Cycle Campaigning Front, the club has been involved in meetings with the City and County councils. We are an Objector to the closure of N/Gate - S/Gate street, and the style of the proposed new junction 12 on the M5. This area of activity is very frustrating, with as many steps backwards as forwards. Unfortunately, cyclists are their own worst enemy, in so much as they do little to help themselves. A number of ideas proposed by the club have been taken up, and this makes it all worthwhile.

The Finances remain in a healthy state, despite the best attempts of the committee to spend! The club invested in a number of items ranging from a ~~new~~ photocopier, a walk-in tent, gas stove & kit, and a publicity sign. These items will be used on a regular basis, benefiting existing

club members, ~~an~~ whilst improving the profile of the club. However we must not become complacent. Expenditure is controlled to ensure maximum benefit to members, and to this end the purchasing of Insurance has been scrutinised by the outgoing committee. The 1995/96 Committee recommend that the Trophy Insurance, costing some £155, is not renewed.

Numbers have been steadily increasing over the past few years, and are currently at 171. We are still looking to reach the elusive 200 mark.

The racing side of the club saw a string of results in the early season, particularly in Time Trials. A number of new members have made their mark on result sheets, both newcomers to the sport ~~and~~ as well as established riders joining the club for the 1st, 2nd or 3rd time. ~~There are~~

~~Also~~ Several records were broken, notably in the ladies 10 and 25, including the first ~~with~~ a sub-hour ride. Sadly, Ann Woodbridge became 1st claim for another club, but retains 2nd claim membership. More of the racing results from the Coach later.

Club clothing is now handled in a different way, with individuals paying 1/2 the cost of the items. This has meant that twice

the amount of clothing was purchased than in previous years. Consequently the 2 sponsors for 1996, Mitsubishi Motors and Dave Swan Cycles, achieved greater exposure than would otherwise have been the case. However the cost of clothing increases each year, whilst the income from sponsors has not altered.

In summary, a successful year on all fronts, with some areas to improve on. The club is probably the premier cycling club in the county, having a sound financial base, a growing membership, and a varied range of activities.

The Club 10 Championship was won by Simon Harradine in his first year with the Club in 21.56 and the Vets by Gerry Downing.

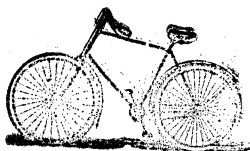
The Club 25 Championship was won by Andy Rolley also in his first year with the Club in a time of 57.07 and again Gerry Downing took the Vets Championship.
