Treasurer Report for 1999

Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Club has this year has had a very good year as far as the finances are concerned. Most events have produced a surplus for the club funds which shows that all the organisers have done well. We have also had one or two additional events, in all we have organised six racing events all of which have helped to help the club funds. I leave the individual organisers to comment further on each event.

The total number of subscriptions received was 82, only one down on 1998 with the membership of the club now standing at 155 a reduction of 3 on the previous year. This is made up as follows:- Life, Vice Presidents & Honorary - 29, Senior - 64, Family - 60, Junior 2. This is the fourth year running that the number of members has declined. 1995 was a record year with a total of 171 members. There have however been 17 new members.

As you must all be aware we have managed to continue the printing of Spokespiece together with the Runs Lists. The cost of this and other various publications has actually been reduced despite most editions having fourteen pages or more. These cost is being held at a reasonable level by members collecting their copies and taking others for members living in their area. Well done, keep it up.

The next Spokespiece & Runs List will be available for collection at the clubroom on Tuesday 18th. January 1999. Contributions by 31st. December please.

With the start of another club year just a reminder that subscriptions are now due.

On the Time Trialing front Richard Clements has been our most consistent performer with top ten placings in almost every event he has ridden. Sadly a broken arm put paid to his season before we really saw him at his best but hopefully he will be raring to go for next year. Andy Jarvis has put in some fast BAR rides at the end of the season and has managed to secure most of the club trophies, despite a short campaign in between exams, a bad knee and getting married.

In the club events, which have not been supported as well as other years, Adrian Rowley has been winning most weeks. Hopefully Adrian will find he has a bit more time next year and will get back to riding opens. Indications are that time trialing could be our strong point next season.

In road racing we should really count it as a success that Ian Humble and Jason Streather signed up for the Amore e Vita semi-pro team, although it has meant that the club doesn't get the benefits of their rides.

I attach the Club Racing Secretary's Report which I would be grateful if you would read.

I was also asked to propose the following motion:
