GENERAL SECRETARIES REPORT TO THE AGM 2001

As always my report overlap's most other Officers territory, so I will attempt not to steal all of their thunder.

The Club activities over the past 12 months have been of the highest quality. What other sporting clubs can boast an event every Sunday of the year, most Tuesday evenings of the year, and many Wednesday evenings of the year? Very few indeed.

The club and sports rides have been well attended, with a good variety of places on the itinerary. Room for improvement is in the general discipline of the rides in keeping together – rather too many people have been lost or left behind. We must consider the limitations of various abilities, in particular where the ride is not a 'C' category. Faster riders should join the 'Sports Ride' – which in turn must be differentiated from the 'Training' ride. This is a perennial problem – but one which can cause discontent and ultimately a loss of membership.

The racing scene has been mixed. Road racing has been quiet with few members racing on a regular basis. The Time Trial scene has been quite successful, with plenty of members racing during the season and a couple of club records being broken – full details of these later.

The open events included 4 road races (one was cancelled due to Foot and Mouth problems), 3 time trials (one new addition to the collection), 2 Cyclo-Cross races and one fun / competitive event. All were run with the high level of organisational effort now a trademark of GCCC events – something that local riders have noted with approval. Hopefully with the help of all, this will continue into 2002.

As a point of interest, last week two Road Record Association rides took place through Gloucester. These were the Lands End to John O'Groats records for Ladies and Mens. Lynne Taylor set a new record of 2 days 5 hours 18 minutes and 21 seconds – taking an hour off Pauline Strongs former record. The following day Gethin Butler also removed almost an hour from Andy Wilkinsons record, with 1 day 20 hours 4 minutes and 19 seconds. A number of club members assisted these riders through Gloucester – I would like to thank them for giving up 2 evenings in a row at such short notice. Both riders have expressed their thanks for all the support they received.

Membership has been static, with a number of new joiners and the usual cull of non-renewed members. The latter can be minimised by reminders – something we neglected this year. The club has leaflets in Halfords, is included on the main Library notice board, is on the Gloucestershire links site and has a web site: but I still feel that word of mouth from our own members to friends and work colleagues is one of the best methods of recruitment. So, the challenge to us all is to recruit one person each – to grow the club can only be a good thing.

Our web site continues to be updated on a regular basis. It is primarily informative in nature – with interest in the shape of photographs for those that are looking for some entertainment! Feedback is positive from both our own members and those of other clubs – so I will attempt to continue the good work. As always, all ideas and suggestions will be gratefully received.

We continue to keep an active interest in campaign issues in Gloucester and Gloucestershire. This is often an uphill task, but ultimately is, I think, worthwhile. The City council are generally receptive to feedback, the County less so. Even so, our suggestions are often ignored or lost in translation. We could do with more members taking an active role in this – after all it is about making cycling more accessible and safe for all, including us! The web site now has a page on campaign issues, and will be further enhanced over the next weeks with contacts etc.

The Club sponsor, Town Cars, has now been with us for 4 years. Talking to Doug Hawkins it is clear that he takes pleasure in seeing reports in the Citizen and in spotting the Town Cars tops around and about — as do his team of salesmen. Doug has therefore willingly agreed to continue sponsoring the club into 2002. To maintain this level of interest it is essential for everyone entering 'open' events of any description — not just racing events — to give a report to the Press Secretary. Without reports it is impossible to put together articles for the Citizen — and without this the sponsorship may not be renewed. It is, as they say, in your control.

The sponsor money has been largely used to discount the cost of club clothing, and this is proposed to continue. However I would like to make the allocation of discount more closely related to the contribution of individuals to the well-being of the club. A paper is available to all attendees of this meeting, and is to be discussed under Any Other Business towards the end of the meeting.

Finally, I regard it as an honour to hold this position, and am prepared to continue if the membership so wishes.

CLUB CLOTHING DISCOUNTS – PROPOSAL FOR DISCUSSION PURPOSES:

3 levels of discount:

1) Basic discount for all members.

All members to receive 25% discount on club tops – this benefits Town Cars. A smaller discount on other items, eg shorts / longs / mits etc. – say 15%?

2) Members helping to run the club in an official capacity.

a)Club Officials (see handbook) attending at least 8 meetings – 15%.

b) Normal Committee member attending at least 8 meetings - 10%;

c) Race Organisers - 15%.

Note - only one of the above 3 to count.

- 3) All members:
- a) Members assisting with the Open race events (time trials / road races / cyclo-cross) 2% per event;
- b) Members reporting their 'results' in events (road races / time trials / audax / sponsored rides etc ie events where you enter and generally pay a fee) to the Press Secretary within 7 days of the event 1% per report capped at say 20%. Currently there is a 'cash for reports' scheme should this continue? If yes, then points would not be available. Something else to consider.

A maximum cap of 65% may be appropriate. A limit on the number of items (probably measured by value) to which the discount could apply is required – say 4 items / value after discount say £120.

There would need to be some flexibility in the overall discount given – if demand is high, then an overall % reduction in the discount (or surcharge per item) could be applied. If demand was not great, further discount across the board (up to a point) could be applied.

The end result is that if you, as a member of this club, are not prepared to assist in any way, then the most discount you will get is the standard 25%. On the other hand, those that are willing to put some time and effort in will be rewarded – assuming they purchase clothing of course!

A system along these lines gives everyone the chance to get discounted clothing.

The mathematics suggest that a larger base discount could be used.

So - what do you think?

Gloucester City Cycling Club Treasurer's report 2001

I had the honour this year of taking over the Club accounts from John Godley who had been Treasurer for more years than I care to remember. He gave them to me in apple pie order and I am pleased to say that one year later they are still in good shape and have been successfully audited by Dave Ponter. You should all have copies of the Balance Sheet which is self explanatory.

We started the year with a balance of £2997.04 and ended with a balance of £3003.29 this is excluding the value of trophies of £6975 which is purely a paper value and to my mind not a realistic figure. So the state of the Club's finances are more or less in the same healthy state as last year.

Significant points to make are:

Club Scrap Book rebinding - hopefully a one off charge of £400

The Annual Dinner made an acceptable loss of £79, although the dinner tickets have gone up to £18.95 for the forthcoming Dinner.

The recurring charge of £340 for results reporting seems out of proportion with other

awards, but was agreed by the Committee.

Club Races both Time Trials and Road Races all made profits, thanks to C & G Sponsorship of £600 although I am unsure if we can count on this for next year. The cancelled Pot Hunters RR this year lost £42.50 and was borne by general Club funds.

I therefore submit the balance sheet for the Club's approval and acceptance.
