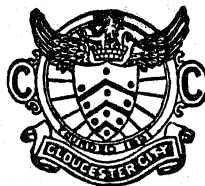

Club Events : held weekly from April to August. 2 Kilometer Sprints were introduced and were quite successful. Dan Knight was won by George Unsworth, 2nd Andy Jarvis, 3rd Paul Barnard. CEBAR Seniors won by George, Ed 2nd and Andy 3rd; Vets won by Paul, Phil Ashby 2nd and Toby Wooldridge 3rd. The 25 course to the A38 turning is not safe – two right hand turns and a dead turn at traffic lights with the A38. The Maisemore – Ledbury course is possibly as fast and safer. Will propose this be the course used for 2003. Risk Assessment has been carried out each week – driving the course in advance of the event.

10 champion – George, Vets – Paul, Junior – Tom Veale with 24.46 ; 25 championships were postponed due to flooding and will be included in the October Open 25.

National TT – club was represented at all events except 12 hour. Tom Veale rode the GHS and the Junior event.

The club provided marshals at the National 50 around Cirencester. It would be most helpful if racers not riding a local Association event would assist with marshaling duties – they are asked but often decline.

WTTA Hardrider series has been most successful and will be expanded next year.

Phil Green is the custodian of the club timekeeping watch and is very pleased with it.

New numbers have been purchased for Open events and will be used for the October 25.

I have attended most RTTC West and WTTA meetings as Club Representative and am an Officer with responsibilities for Club Event date fixing / courses and general operations.

Due to these additional responsibilities I will not be able to deal with the Club Trophy Claims and Engraving. Debbie Light has agreed to take on this task. Claims should still be sent to Ann for verification – they will then be sent on to Debbie.

The new Gloucester – Severn Bridge – Gloucester record has been set by Andy Jarvis, the details are awaited.

Mike Davis has taken an interest in Trike racing and took part in the race on the A38 (U18R).



GENERAL SECRETARIES REPORT TO THE AGM 2002

The club has, I think, had another successful year. Success can be measured in a number of ways : membership, finance, activities.

One of the disappointments is in regard to new members – there have been only 6 in the past 12 months. However we are still a large club by most cycle club standards, with current membership at 148. This is down 11 from last year.

The financial aspects are very healthy, as the Treasurers report will tell. This is in part to a control of expenditure, but also to a variety of funds being available – from our sponsors Town Cars, from membership (still very good value at £12 per year for Senior membership) and donations, and from most if not all the Open events producing a profit (some considerably more than others!).

But the best marker is in the activities of the club and it's members : Four Open time trials, 3 road races, 2 cyclo-cross races, one fun ride, the usual set of varied club racing events, Sunday rides (often with 2 and occasionally 3 sets of rides), Tuesday evening events, two weekend tours, and not forgetting representation at the Gloucester City and County cycle forums. In addition to all this is the activities of various club members in home and overseas tours and rides.

The racing scene has seen Ann win a number of Open events and take part in 6 out of 7 National events, from the 10 to the 24 hour. Numerous others have been busy in local and not so local events. The WTTA Hardriders series has been most exciting with the lead changing hands on several occasions. 6 club members will have completed 6 events by the end of the season. George Unsworth has broken the hour mark for a 25 – on the Bristol Road no less. Some of the less youthful members have been active and successful, with Stuart Burlinson and Dave Mundy improving or getting very close to all time PB's this year. At the other end of the spectrum Tom Veale has made a spectacular start at just 15. More details in the racing Secretaries report. It is good to see a range of individuals all enjoying the racing scene.

Road Racing has seen notable success with George winning a couple of events and moving up to 2nd category.

Meanwhile the touring section has seen a number of club and private tours at home and overseas. It is always good to read about these in the action-packed Spokespiece.

The web site continues to be updated on a regular basis. This takes a considerable amount of time but is ultimately worthwhile – a number of new members joined via the site. It has also attracted some interest from America, with queries being received in relation to the For Sale page and the page with interesting bikes! There have been 3,500 hits since 01/01/2002. As always, all ideas and suggestions will be gratefully received. I can only add what I am informed about – it's up to you.

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
The Club sponsor, Town Cars, has been with us for 5 years. Doug Hawkins is looking for local publicity through the Citizen (photos incorporating club tops and references to Town Cars) and the club clothing being used around and about.

Thanks to this ongoing exposure Doug has confirmed his willingness to continue the sponsorship into 2003. We have also benefitted from use of the Town Cars car for our open events.

It is essential for everyone entering 'open' events of any description – not just racing events – to give a report to the Press Secretary. Without reports it is impossible to put together articles for the Citizen – and without this the sponsorship may not be renewed. It's up to you. Racers entering events must include Town Cars on the entry form.

As before the sponsor money has been largely used to discount the cost of club clothing, and this is proposed to continue. The next order will take into account the contribution of individual to the well-being of the club, as agreed at the previous AGM and publicised in Spokespiece.

To finish, I regard it as an honour to hold this position, and am prepared to continue if the membership so wishes.





Gloucester City Cycling Club Account Year ending 31 August 2002

Please accept my apologies for not being present but I should be starting on a mountain bike tour of Monument Park today!

The accounts I hope have been accepted by the Auditor so subject to his comments, I have the following remarks to make:

- 1 The Open 10, 25 and 30 TTs all made a profit of 3.26, 45.80 and 22.50 respectively. The accounts do not show this but when the C & G Sponsorship is taken into account the profit is revealed.
- 2 There will be a small amount of interest to come as the Bank statement arrived after I had closed the books.
- 3 CTC affiliation and insurance is for only until October 2002 and the insurance no longer includes the 3rd party liability for members. This was the subject of an article in Spokespiece earlier this year.




Coaches Report

Development Group

At last years AGM the club agreed to the setting up of a development group to look at ways of attracting interest in cycling and new members to the cycling club, particularly young people. The group got off to a good start with five club members attending the first meeting – Alastair Goldie, Stuart Burlingson, Andy Jackson, Nursheila Jaffa and myself. The group looked at the various BCF initiatives aimed at young people, Get Set, Challenge and Improve, at this and subsequent meetings, including a meeting with the BCF Regional Cycling Development Officer Chris Revill..

After some consideration the Get Set and Improve schemes were considered to require too great a commitment for the group members at the time and we were unfortunately too late to organise a Challenge heat by the time that we decided that that was our best option.

Nursheila, Andy, Stuart and Alastair attended a Sports Coach UK course entitled Child Protection and Best Practice during the winter which was generally considered to have been valuable.

Since the Spring there have been no further meetings of the group so no further progress has been made.

At the present time I am unable to commit myself to organising regular coaching sessions due to my wife's commitments and will therefore have to put my ideas on hold and see how things develop next year.
