Gloucester City Cycling Club Annual Accounts for the year ending 31 August 2006

I have pleasure in presenting the accounts for the year ending 31 August 2006 and I am grateful to our Honorary auditor, Ed Spurway for examining them.

Copies of the balance sheet have been distributed and you will notice that I have given last year's figures for comparison; they are in italics and are on the left hand side of each column.

I will talk you through the figures:

The total balance carried forward from last year does not show the £3740.86 in the deposit account making total club funds then £4170.53. This years ending balance is £3527.09 which is £646.44 less than last year. However, there is £1114 worth of unsold clothing which if all sold would give us a greater balance than last year. As you will recall we no longer receive cash sponsorship but obtain club clothing at pretty much cost and sell to members with a modest mark up to go towards club funds.

Looking at some of the figures more closely you will see that income from subscriptions has gone down, not because of lack of members but because there are more family subscriptions and also more senior members have moved into the life members category and do not pay a subscription but we received £75 in donations some of which came from life members and we thank them. The Standing Order facility we introduced last year resulted in 12 members paying by SO and I would encourage others to do so as it saves me chasing late subs.

Donations paid out came to £60 regrettably due to deaths of members. No major donations were made in 2006 and the Committee may wish to consider a suitable charity for the coming year to make amends. For interest we made donations in the previous year to Sustrans, £575 Tsunami appeal £50, BAGG £25 and Headway amounting to £763.

CTC Affiliation and insurance now runs from 1 October each year and the £50 premium will appear in next year's accounts.

Most of the races made a modest profit when the C & G Sponsorship is taken into account.

The C & G sponsorship money, £600, was paid directly into the deposit account and then paid out to the Race organisers when required thus earning interest. It is therefore not shown on the current account other than being incorporated into the income from the various races.

The popularity of Club Time Trials have produced a balance of £276.51 although we still have to pay the Dan Knight prizes, expenses for the organiser and petrol money to timekeepers who have to check the course for H & S purposes.

Clothing appears to be making a profit, (£113.5) and as I mentioned earlier we have unsold stock amounting to £1114 which with the balance makes up our "sponsorship" money to the same as in the past when we received it from Town Cars. The system is therefore working well thanks to Toby's salesmanship.

We have spent £1475 on engraving which also includes the refurbishment of trophies as agreed by the Committee last year. Debbie Light has done an excellent job on this and is to be thanked.

There are some yet to be done as we agreed to phase it over 2 years. We have also had to purchase fresh stocks of medals and the remaining charge will appear in next year's accounts.

Although the dinner tickets were subsidised by the Club, the loss was £377.06, £100 more than the previous year. This year's dinner is likely to lose even more as we have lost our deposit at the Gordon League because of the change of venue.

From 1 September 2004 we moved our account to Alliance and Leicester which pays a very good rate of interest on the deposit account amounting to £118.09 this year. The amount of interest is down as the rate was lowered and we have used some of the capital during the year.

As I said at the beginning this years ending balance is £3527.09 which is £646.44 less than last year but with the addition of the unsold clothing there would be a balance of £4641.09 which would be £470.65 greater than last year. I therefore feel the Club finances continue to be sound and seek your approval of the accounts.

Social Secretary's Report 2005-2006

The Gibb Shield competition has proven to be a closely contested affair in recent years, and this year was even closer than ever with only 4 points covering the first three places. The winner was Alistair Goldie, with 141 points to Theo's 138 and Toby's 137. See the results sheet for the remaining places.

This put an end to Theo's domination of the event for the last three years, so congratulations to Ali G, who I believe has not won it before.

The attendance for the quizzes at the clubroom was much the same as in recent years, with an average of 9 people competing for each of the three quizzes that took place. However, having said that, one quiz, the General Secretary's cycling quiz, did not take place because not enough people turned up on the night. I do not know what was going on that night (it was the 21st Feb) – was everyone on a training camp somewhere sunny?

The attendance at the clubhouse for slide shows was very poor this time round. Hopefully this is just one of those things and next year will be better.

The attendance for the evening competition (single events, such as Freewheeling) was also similar to previous years – average 5 competitors for each one. However the Speed Judging and barbeque was not well attended. Thanks to the Jarvises as ever for having us. I am proposing that next year we move this to a Friday evening and make it a much bigger event – same format with the cycling competition and barbeque, but get an idea of numbers beforehand and have volunteers to help with the catering and perhaps get people to bring some starters and desserts (and alcohol) and make a much bigger thing of it – on a week night it's not such an attractive proposition. I will check that the John and Sadie are OK with this proposal.

The attendance on the evening rides out to pubs was not so good this year, with generally the same 3 or 4 people coming out, and there were fewer individuals scoring points on these rides over the season. I propose that next year the ride starts earlier, at 6.30, so as to allow people to come out and get to the pub in time to eat, and to get home a bit earlier for work the next day.

Generally, not a bad year for the Social Competition but hopefully the proposals I am making will improve things next year.

REPORT OF PRESS SECRETARY - GERRY MCGARR SEASON 2006

Well Ladies and Gentlemen,

First of all my apologies for being unable to attend the AGM this evening but one of the chores if that is the correct word when you are a Grandparent is babysitting!

I thank Richard for reading this for me.

What a season 2006 has been for the Club – in my opinion it has been one of the most successful since the days when we had imported star riders join us in the 1990's.

The Citizen has been fair and I believe give us a good deal – get the report in early and in my experience it is always

printed - albeit often abbreviated. That is a problem a press secretary has to accept.

I took on the job – because I strongly believe it is an important part in encouraging riders, crucial publicity for the sport as well as the Club. I also believe that it is the least riders should expect for all the commitment and expense incurred in racing.

I have submitted 72 press releases for this season – I have for the information of the incoming secretary submitted the

report for last weekends racing including the superb performance by George Unsworth.

My only complaint is that not enough members informed me of there performances – it is not good enough and you are fortunate that I obtained results off the internet – on many occasions I was tempted not to bother. I will not be standing for the post next year.

If I may I would like to make my observations on this years performances — Yours truly I suppose didn't start off badly with a 3rd place and then a 2nd place in the Port Talbot 2 up 25 — crossing the line in 55.05 on March 6th when it had snowed I think is crazy — but it is all about choosing the right partner in two-ups!

On to the real stars of the season:

Andy Palmer was the first to shine with 9th place a 24.10 in Dursley 10 in March he later followed this up with a 57PB Chris Vasey followed with quality rides including a superb 58 for 6th place down in Wales when the fast course could not be used—to put the ride into perspective he beat riders who recorded 52's a week later.

John Flint recorded a PB 58.41 before his accident in a road race and would have defiantly knocked a couple of minutes off that time later in the season.

GEORGE UNSWORTH has really turned a corner organizer of the Steve Taylor and then the winner – only the second rider in Club history to break 4 hours for a 100 – fantastic ride – I saw him when he finished - he had given 110% - at the other extreme 20 minute 10 – PB's at 10, 25, 50, 100 & 12

And what about the three Cities attempt? John Barnes very sportingly stated he would have got the record if the weather had been better.

Darren Jewell – what an inspiration he must be to every member – struggling in the winter and then in the Welsh 12 nearly beating George recording 239 miles in his first 12 – being a member of the first Gloucester City team to finish the BBAR – The Club is at present in 9th position with every member qualifying for a BBAR certificate. PB's at 10 (21.34) 25(58.09) 50 (2.04)100 (4.16) 12 (239) Fantastic – on top of that he is giving a lot of help to Rupert Denny are future star. A competitor in the GHS 10 where he got 3rd place in his age category.

Toby Wooldridge we know he has stamina but speed? Ladies and Gentlemen 22 02 for a 10 is fast I personally think that was one of the rides of the season (not just because he beat me!), he followed that up the following day with his second fastest 25 - 59.55 (and that was not on Glyneath!) he is another who has gone from strength to strength and his 100 of 4.23 was a PB

GUY PREECE – is now one of the best riders in the club – FACT, in open events is usually always in the first 10 – one of the few riders to have broken the hour for the club course – course record holder for 10 course until George improved it .PB'd constantly throughout season is now a 21 minute man and I believe 57 minutes for 25 which I would imagine will be greatly reduced next season. DAN KNIGHT winner.

Derek Dowdeswell well done on a 21 ten - Chris Colquhoun on her debut 12 209 miles - John Murphy riding all BBAR distances and recording a PB 25 58 the night before his 100.

Finally Eddie BAUD he has recorded at 62 yrs of age a PB 10 22.55, recorded the 2nd fastest 50 with 1.57.16 and then 2 weeks ago beat George and yours truly to record a fantastic 54.26 to record the fastest time by a member this season – brilliant – well done to all and everybody who has raced this season.
